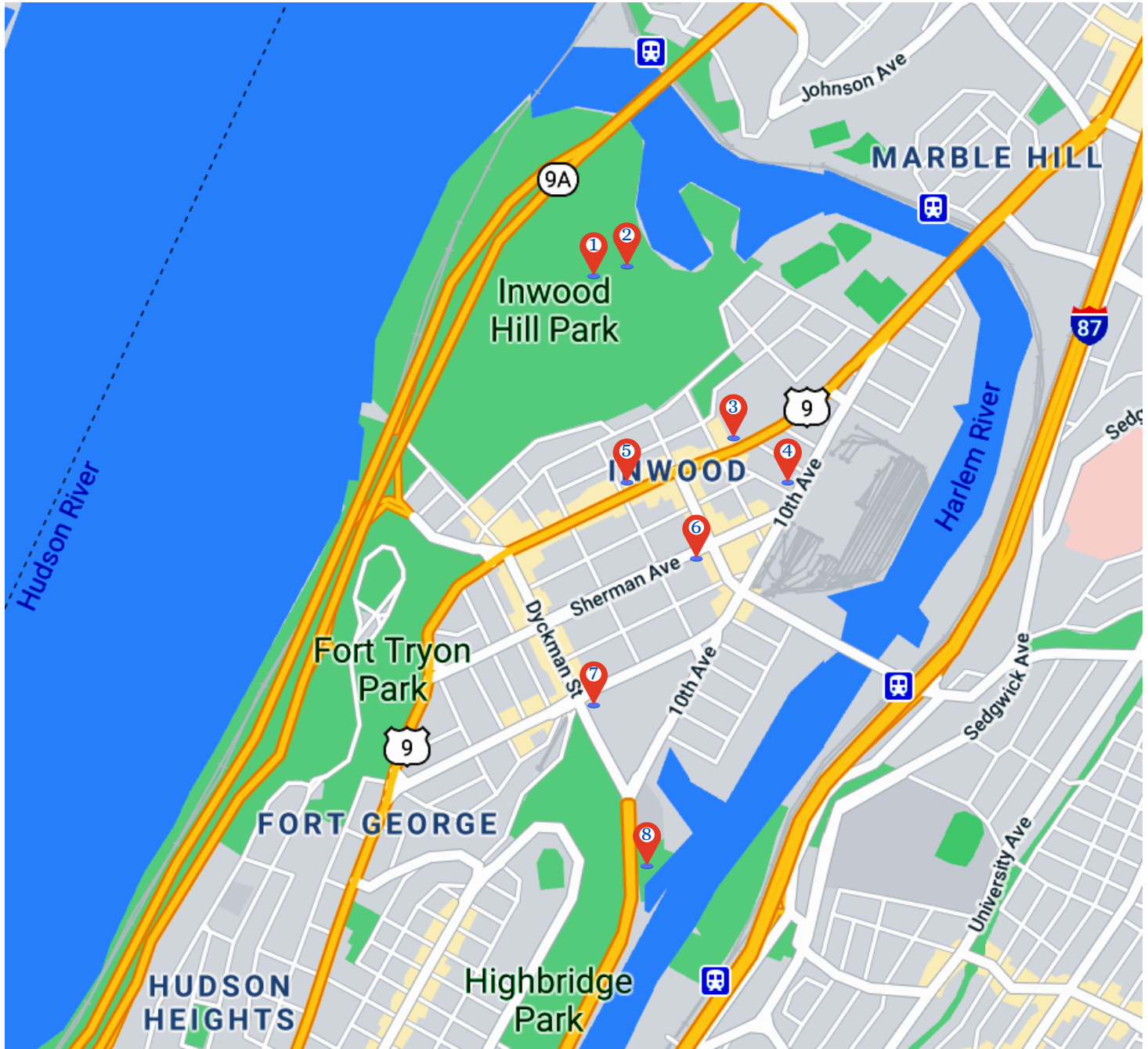

| <p><b>1</b> These tumbled rocks from a glacial retreat over 30,000 years ago served as shelter to the Lenape.</p>     | <p><b>5</b> Built in 1784 by an Inwood family, this building is the oldest of its kind left on Manhattan island.</p>      |
| <p><b>2</b> This is the location where the Dutch supposedly purchased Manhattan from the Lenape.</p>                  | <p><b>6</b> Now a thrift store, this was once a place for books, one of its many locations started by Eliza Hamilton.</p> |
| <p><b>3</b> Embedded in the wall, this was one of many made in 1769 to measure the distance to City Hall.</p>         | <p><b>7</b> This was once the location of this sports venue, home to the first U.S. Latino team, the NY Cubans.</p>       |
| <p><b>4</b> One of many locations seeking recognition, this resting place was discovered &amp; destroyed in 1903.</p> | <p><b>8</b> Now a garden maintained by local schools, this spot once served as a communal dumping ground.</p>             |
